PREFACE



PREPARATION IS KEY

Consider factors such as:


- Location



STEP 2: UNDERSTANDING THE APPLICATION PROCESS

As universities may have different application processes, it's important to understand the requirements and deadlines for each one.




How can you help?

- Make sure your student has gathered all the necessary documents and information ready to submit their application before or by the deadline.
- Documents may include:
 Personal statement
 - Academic transcripts
 - References
 - Entrance exams or interviews
- You can help your student by proofreading their personal statement, providing feedback, and helping them prepare for exams or interviews.



STEP 3: FINANCIAL PLANNING

University can be expensive, so it's important to start planning early.



How can you help?



Research the different funding options available, such as:

- Student loans
- Scholarships
- Bursaries
- Grants
- Encourage your student to apply for as many funding opportunities as possible to help ease the financial burden, if relevant.
- You can also help them by creating a budget, setting up a bank account, and teaching them how to manage their money and pay bills. Check our budgeting <u>blogs</u> for more information.

STEP 4: FINDING ACCOMMODATION

Many universities offer on-campus <u>accommodation</u>, and it's important to research options based on your budget and needs.

Campus universities are convenient, with everything in one location — lectures, accommodation, and amenities, which creates a safe, student-oriented environment. City universities may have facilities spread across the town, requiring travel between locations but offering a more immersive city experience.

While campus living is common in the first year, students will likely need to find their own housing for their second year. It's important to research options, depending on your budget and requirements.

Key factors to consider are:

- Rent
- Bills
- Security
- Transport
- Amenities



How can you help?



Look for suitable and safe locations near to the university, to avoid additional transport costs.



Encourage your student to visit the accommodation in person, if possible, to get a better idea of the facilities & area.



You can also help them by helping them move using our checklists and helpful guides, organising transportation, and providing them with essentials such as bedding, kitchenware and toiletries.

STEP 5: PREPARE FOR THE MOVE



Moving away from home can be a daunting experience for your student and may be their first taste of independence living away from home.

How can you help?
